1. Silent Prayer/Pledge of Allegiance

- 2. Opening Comments from the Chair Highlights include participation in the JEPB Symposium at UNF and making NACD news. We are now working toward an urban agriculture grant.
- 3. Introduction of Guest Kay Ehas (Groundwork Jacksonville)
 - a. Groundwork Jacksonville, Inc. is a partnership between the COJ, US National Park Service, US EPA and Groundwork USA, Inc. and is part of the Groundwork USA network. Groundwork Jacksonville is one of 20 such trusts across the country, the only Groundwork trust in Florida and the first in the Southeastern US.
 - b. Groundwork Jacksonville is the city's primary non-profit specifically created to clean and redevelop Hogans and McCoys creeks and convert contaminated land into parks, playgrounds, trails, and other public spaces to create the "emerald necklace" championed by famed architect Henry Klutho in the early 20th Century.
 - c. Groundwork and COJ are working together to restore McCoys Creek with a budget of \$60 million over the next three years to return McCoys Creek to a naturally meandering flow to prevent flooding, significantly improve water quality, restore fish/wildlife habitat and create a more resilient ecosystem along the western end of the Emerald Trail.
 - d. The Trail Master Plan also includes improvements to Hogans Creek that improve the water quality and habitat to make it accessible for fishing, kayaking and recreation.
 - e. They will develop community-based partnerships which empower people, businesses and organizations to promote environmental, economic and social well-being.
 - f. The Emerald Trail is a nationally recognized centerpiece attracting people to Jacksonville, connects urban core neighborhoods that are valued as vital and desirable places to live, work, and visit. As a result, 28 city parks will need redevelopment.
