- Annual Report All board members should send Josie highlights for the annual report by the Oct 2 planning meeting
- 2. Urban Ag Grant Joshua Rosenberg
 - a. Josh met with Carrie Davis of Wealth Watchers to discuss revisions to the grant application from 2018
 - b. Discussion included a food forest at A. Philip Randolph park
 - c. Need to add language to the grant highlighting past successes with conservation efforts
 - d. Need to add details to project specifications to include names, types of plants, etc.
 - e. Grant proposal should be available for us to review by Oct Full Board meeting
 - f. Grant to include Josh as Consultant Contractor
- 3. Bylaws
 - a. Need to consider language that provides for affiliate members to receive compensation beyond reimbursement for grant-associated services
 - b. Plan to revise and approve Bylaws at Oct Full Board meeting
 - c. Other SWCDs want to see our Bylaws once revised

- 4. Administrative Concerns
 - a. Jennifer will bring a quote for ordering 300-500 district brochures to Full Board meeting
 - b. Allen provides an updated hard copy of the Contact Information sheet, Josie will distribute via email
 - c. Request for Service Form is on website as a download, but Jennifer will see if electronic submission of a web form is possible
 - d. Business cards needed for affiliate members with their personal email and title "Affiliate Member"

- 5. Envirothon
 - a. There has been interest from middle school teachers/students in participating in Envirothon

- b. We need to consider inviting middle school teachers to the Envirothon
- c. We need to consider allowing middle school students to participate in the educational workshops, but not the Envirothon
- d. We will ask James Cook to interview our Envirothon Featured Teacher for FB/website
- 6. Treat Our Teachers Meeting Jennifer Casey
 - a. Our first event was highly successful with good attendance and follow-up email has been sent with link to the presentation
 - b. We have a second event planned for Oct 20 with several RSVPs already, menu set with \$200 budget, 13 Gypsies is provided an in-kind sponsorship of \$300 in food/beverage
 - c. Allen mentions that we should consider larger venues for future events
 - d. Request from a teacher that attended included helping private schools become eligible for local Green Ribbon award nominations, Jennifer will research
 - e. Related Jennifer will be presenting briefly at the DCPS Green Champion kickoff meeting on Sep 25 to 30-40 teachers, needs materials
- 7. Local Working Group Ed Wright
 - a. Ed shares plans for 2019 LWG including that he's working on a letter and invitation
 - b. Minutes from 2018 LWG are provided for the record
 - c. Discussion about the importance of promoting LWG, increasing partnerships
 - d. Josh offers to assist with planning the event
 - e. Important language over the years: "Soil, Water, Air, Plants, People", "Beyond the Farm Boundary", "Keep the Farm in the Larger Picture"
 - f. Based on availability, Josh will be assigned as the affiliate member to work with Ed on LWG instead of John B. who is indicated in the Plan of Operations
- 8. Potential Coastal Resiliency Initiative
 - a. Conversation around the types of success that come out of LWG lead to a discussion about the Beaches
 - b. Discussion of dune planting efforts needing diversity and not just sea oats
 - c. Jennifer will send Josh link to Brooksville Plant Materials Center
 - d. Potential partners for any projects might include Mayor Ellen Glasser in Atlantic Beach and Beaches Go Green might be a potential source of volunteers for planting effort
- 9. EWP Program Allen provides a fact sheet and Jennifer will share on FB when provided with link
- 10. Citizen Requests
 - a. Student Interview Request is unclear, but Allen will handle if soil and water is the topic, Jennifer will handle if topic is political science

 - c. Allen Skinner/White Harvest Farms Allen Moore fulfilled request for farm visit

- 12. JEPB Symposium at UNF
 - a. Josie will ask Hunter for details about tabling
 - b. Allen, Jennifer and Hunter will attend
 - c. Allen will set up and work morning and Jennifer will work afternoon and tear down
 - d. Allen will bring the Envirothon and poster/speech contest flyers

- 13. Farm-City Week Support We need Hunter to bring a check for the Duval Agricultural Council as approved at last Full Board meeting
- 14. Financial Compliance Reporting Hunter needs to review the Special District Fee due Dec 1 and whether we are eligible for a waiver
- 15. Photo Contest
 - a. Deadline is Oct 20, 2019
 - b. Hunter needs to prepare a blog post with application and photo release forms provided by Allen at last board meeting so that we can promote it
 - c. We need to establish a panel of judges and protocols special meeting needs to be called before Nov 5 Start Farming Panel in order to present awards at that event
- 16. Land Judging Josh and Ed will schedule a visit to Eden gardens before Sep Full Board meeting
- 17. Start Farming Panel SJC SWCD will partner with us and invite farmer to be on the panel
- 18. Duval Food Forest & Pollinator Habitat Project– Jennifer Casey
 - a. Jennifer has been working with Josh since early June to develop a permaculture demonstration project on public property in Durkeeville near the S-line bike trail (to include a pollinator habitat and food forest demonstration)
 - b. Looking for input on the project now and are proposing that DSWCD consider adopting a resolution of support for the project by Jan 2020 (proposal to include rationale for the project, conservation and community goals, and identification of potential partners and possible funding sources)
 - c. St. Johns Riverkeeper Lisa Rinaman has offered to write us a letter of support
 - d. A possible major partner would be Groundwork Jacksonville who is working on developing a biodiversity corridor in the same area as part of their Emerald Trail project
 - e. Kay Ehas will be a guest speaker at Sep Full Board in order to update the board on the Emerald Trail project
